NURSE PRACTITIONERS

- Earn specialized masters- or doctorate-level training from an accredited university
- Pass national board certification and exams
- Must pass a rigorous Texas Board of Nursing licensing review

Cut health care costs.

Pass SB 2438 and HB 1792



NPs care for Texans every day. But Texas law requires them to contract with a physician for "supervision."



In some settings, physicians can delegate to an **unlimited** number of NPs.

These contracts cost NPs **an average of \$6,000 per year.**


spend millions of dollars and hundreds of thousands of hours on red tape, not direct patient care.

BY LAW, THESE PHYSICIANS:

- **Don't** need to see or provide care for the NP's patients
- **Don't** need to review a minimum number of patient charts
- **Don't** need to approve or sign off on the care provided by the NP to patients
- **Don't** have to set foot in the clinic or even be in the same city as the NP

CURRENT LAW REQUIRES:

• One monthly face-to-face visit
